

In late 2017, the Folsom Chamber of Commerce joined with several other local chambers in the greater Sacramento region to form the United Chamber Advocacy Network (U-CAN).

In 2018, the UCAN Chambers took positions on over 30 individual bills that were consistent with the identified priorities of our members. The Legislature concurred with UCAN positions 60% of the time and only one UCAN opposed bill was signed into law by Governor Brown.

By working together to develop a proactive, pro-small business, state-level policy agenda that is grounded in our members' own experience and perspective, we believe we will more effectively influence the legislators who represent our communities at the State Capitol.

And, by working with our lobbying team at Advocacy and Management Group in Sacramento, we'll be more effective influencing the Legislature as a whole – advancing our shared agenda before legislators, staff and committees.
